Disciplinary steps and actions

- please note that teachers will usually manage classroom disciplinary problems
- teachers can report students who regularly disrespect codes or policies to the Centre's manager who may speak to you or your parents will meet with your parents and may ask you to sign a Behavioural Improvement Plan (BIP) for an agreed period.
