Summer Reading Task for Uni Prep Students

Reading a novel for academic and critical thinking purposes is quite different from how we usually read books. As you are read the novel, it is important you think about themes and issues and how these link to your life, to other texts, and to the wider world.

Please make sure you have finished reading the novel before the first class in September and have prepare the task below.

1. As you are reading, highlight any quotes or sections of the novel that grab your attention or seem important / symbolic in some way.
2. Make a list of themes that come up in the novel and collect key quotations linked to these.
3. Make notes on the different characters. To what extent do you sympathise with each one and why?
4. Consider what the author's message is and how they convey this.
